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RE: Cooper Hawk 3BP KAT Oral Treatment

Canine Neutered Male, Alaskan Husky, born: fall 2007

July 20th 2020 Tumor size and description:

10 x 8 x 5cm, hard fixed sarcoma on midline of proximal chest. Tumor had ruptured as shown in figure 1. He had poor appetite, lethargy and depression.

Started KAT orally, 5 days on two days off, on July 20th and continued treatment until Nov. 20th 2020. By August 11th 2020 there was dramatic improvement with tumor reduced in size to 5x4x3 cm (figure 2). The tumor had softened with the ruptured area still healing. No adverse side effects noticed, his energy level improved, as well as his appetite. He seemed much happier.

Nov 16th 2020 after just 4 months using oral KAT the tumor is no longer present (figure 3).

Cooper received oral KAT for two more months. After a total of 6 months on KAT, Cooper showed no adverse effects of treatment and continues to have more energy along with a better appetite.

Cooper's current picture (figure 4). Only scar tissue and some extra skin remain. The tumor appears to be completely gone. He is doing great and is now over 14 years old.

Seeing such dramatic results with the use of KAT 3BP is very encouraging. The lack of adverse effects of treatment in Cooper suggests a high safety margin and possible wide range of uses. I look forward to helping many more animals with KAT 3BP.
